



## ROTARY CLUB OF CALOUNDRA PACIFIC CHARITY GOLF DAY 2009 TOURNAMENT RULES

- This is a fun day and should be played in this spirit.
- The Ambrose tournament will be played in teams of four. If a player does not have an official handicap, the maximum that can be used is 18 for males and 27 for females
- The team selects a captain (usually the lowest handicapped golfer to be the marker).
- The players then each play a shot from the tee and the dice is then rolled to establish which ball is in play. (IDAHO ROLL) if No 4 is rolled then the fourth person's ball is used. If heads is rolled the best shot is used and if tails is rolled the worst shot is used. This process is only to determine which tee shot is used.
- The player whose ball was chosen has the next shot and then each remaining player drops their ball within one club length of the spot, but no nearer the hole, and plays their next shot in the order originally decided. This procedure continues irrespective of whether the ball is on the fairway, in the rough or in a hazard, until the play reaches the green.
- On the green, the best position is again decided upon and marked. Each player then places their ball within a card length of this spot and has one putt in turn. (For expediency
- The card is marked as for a single stroke round and the lowest score (minus the Team Handicap) wins the competition.
- It is important to note that every player must have their handicap marked on the card.
- Only one score is kept for the entire team, regardless of the number of members.
- The Team Handicap is calculated by adding those of all players and dividing the total by 8. For a team of four, 6 for a team of three and 4 for a team of two.
- The Net Score is calculated by subtracting the Team Handicap from the Gross Score.
- Longest Drive holes will be Hole #5 & #10, the straightest drive Holes will be # 8 & #14

Nearest the pin prizes on all Par 3's (Hole #2 / Hole #6 / Hole #9 / Hole # 11 and #15) there will be a ladies only prize for the second shot to Holes #9 and #14.

## Dress Code

Please ensure your guests are advised in advance of the following dress regulations, as players will be refused to play if incorrectly dressed.

The dress code is as follows;

1. Tailored pants or shorts
2. Men must wear a collared shirt, tucked in.
3. Denim jeans or denim shorts are not permitted.
4. Board shorts, football shorts, football socks are not permitted
5. Soft spikes shoes are required

## General

1. All teams must be registered and paid in full by team captain no later than entry close date on Friday 15h May 2009
2. All entry fee payment made either by credit card or cheque will be given a receipt made out to company at the registration table before tee off time. Team captains that registered the team must collect this from registration officer.
3. All credit card details provided will be kept private and will be in conformance with our YMCA personal privacy and security policies.

## Food & Beverage

- No food, soft drinks or alcohol will be permitted on the course unless purchased from the club house or catering buggies.

## Cancellation Policy

1. The course will be declared closed by Club Management if it is considered unplayable due to adverse weather or other reasons.
2. If the course is declared closed due to bad weather once tournament play has commenced, the tournament will be cancelled with no refund.
3. In the event of rain or cancellation of the tournament a reserve date will be assigned. This date will be advised and subject to course availability and bookings.
4. If a team or company has paid in full and cannot attend on the day for any given reason, a no refund or cancellation policy will apply.

# Advertising Banners & Corporate Signage

1. Advertising banners and signs that the Golf Day Organizer would like to place on the course or clubhouse must have prior approval from the Club Management.
2. Caloundra Golf Club will erect approved banners for the golf event, provided that they are supplied by the required date and time.
3. Banners and signs must be received by the Club no later than 72 hours before the event. If the banners are not received 72 hours in advance of the event, the Club cannot guarantee that they will be erected in time for the event.
4. Caloundra Golf Club and the Rotary Club of Caloundra Pacific is not responsible or liable for loss or damage to any banners.

## General Rules

1. Each player must have their own set of golf clubs. Left and right handed hire clubs are available for rental.
2. Practice on golf course before play is not permitted.
3. All men must play from the white tee and the ladies from the red.
4. All players must accept the instructions and directions of the Tournament Director.
5. The person who has signed for the golf buggy will be fully responsible for any damage to the Club's property, inclusive of golf cart damage caused by participants.
6. Caloundra Golf Club accepts no responsibility for loss of personal effects left on the course, in the changing rooms or any other parts of the Club.
7. Caloundra Golf Club is not responsible or liable for any injuries, accidents or fatalities that arise on the golf course, clubhouse or any part of the Club.
